A List of Enrollment in the Chase Summer School of Art

Carmel-by-the-Sea, California, 1914

The following is a very incomplete list of the enrolled students. No official roster has yet been located. It is only when a contemporary source or an authoritative biography mentions the presence of an artist at this Chase School that the name and the city of residence in 1914 are included below. Whenever possible, a biographical reference is appended to each of the thirty-nine listings.

According to the school's official brochure, tuition for the full twelve-week course (June 29th thru September 21st) was \$75.00, while any eight weeks in that period was \$60.00. Students "who pay in advance" and include an additional payment of \$5.00 or \$10.00 were entitled during May and/or June "to all privileges of the school," namely use of the studios and preparatory instruction by C. P. Townsley. For those who did not desire to work in the classes, but only to attend Mr. Chase's art talks and criticisms, there was the category of "Associate Member" at one half the regular tuition. In recognition of her contribution to the school, Chase personally waived the tuition of Jennie V. Cannon (MPH, January 23, 2000, p.4-F). Classes were organized on similar lines to the Shinnecock Hills Summer School where two days each week were devoted to criticizing the work of every student. On Monday mornings Chase gave "a general criticism" and "a talk on art" in the studios.

We learn from one local newspaper that "arrangements have been made whereby he [Chase] will bring many of his pupils from New York to study" (SFX, April 27, 1913, p.45). According to Cannon's autobiography, Chase had an enrollment "when he began the summer session in Carmel . . . of one hundred pupils, for the most part beginners. A few advanced students came to be with him from Pennsylvania, Connecticut, and New York" (Cannon, *Drama*, p.105). In her diary Cannon counted sixty-six students, including two "visitors," who attended Chase's first Monday criticism (Cannon, *Diaries*, July 6, 1914). Within a few days there was an habitual "crowd" of sightseers. Due to Chase's late arrival in Carmel, the first week of scheduled classes was cancelled.
